# Commissioners lobby legislators for money to pay for state-mandated programs

Clark County's three commissioners, **Craig Pridemore**, **Betty Sue Morris** and **Judie Stanton**, last week took their financial case to the state legislature.

"For more than five years we have been trimming our spending to live within state law, property tax limits and the rollback in motor vehicle fees," said commission chair Pridemore.

Her added, "We've run out of ways to trim around the edges. The level of local service is declining, and we are facing serious barriers to maintaining basic services such as criminal justice and public health."

The commissioners focused on three issues:

- The county's inability to pay for state mandated programs without state funding, which includes criminal justice, growth management and environmental protection.
- The need for funding for state facilities, in particular the NE 134th Street Interstate 5 and 205 interchange.
- Local options to raise money and allocate money from existing sources.

Pridemore concluded, "We have been a leader in stretching the dollars that we receive through taxes fees and grants. Now we need the flexibility to offer our citizens more choices to pay for the services they value. We cannot maintain previous levels of service due to population increases, inflation and revenue limitations."
