#### I-205 between Highway 500 and NE 134th Street closed 8 p.m. Friday to 5 a.m. Monday

Construction of an I-205 pedestrian overpass near the Padden Expressway overpass will take precedence over vehicular traffic on I-205 beginning at 8 p.m. tonight and ending at 5 a.m. Monday, weather permitting.

The entire stretch of I-205 between Highway 500 and NE 134th Street will be closed. The most logical detour is I-5, says **Don Owings**, state Department of Highways engineer.

The pedestrian bridge, a cooperative project of the highway department and Clark County, is being built with some of the largest concrete girders ever used in bridge construction on the West Coast.

Three sets of two 187-foot long girders will be placed on abutments and columns already completed.

The 12- to 14-foot wide pedestrian and bicycle bridge will be about 600 feet long when completed in July. No further highway closures are anticipated during the remaining construction.

Motorists should anticipate some delays in traffic on Highway 500 at the I-205 interchange and at the 134th Street interchange with I-205, Owings said.

Although installation of the girders should be spectacular, there are no nearby viewing spots, according to Owings.

#### Healthier, more comfortable homes is subject of free utility program Tuesday
