# Vancouver city council to act on I-5 partnership recommendations tonight

The Vancouver City Council is expected to adopt the recommendations of the Portland/Vancouver I-5 Transportation and Trade Partnership at its regular meeting at 7 p.m. tonight.

The partnership was put together by the governors of Washington and Oregon two years ago. Its membership consisted of 13 Washingtonians and 13 Oregonians.

Major recommendations for the I-5 corridor are:

- ?? Three through lanes in each direction at Delta Park.
- ?? A phased light-rail loop in Clark County in the vicinity of I-5, Highway 500, Fourth Plain Boulevard and I-205
- ?? An additional or replacement I-5 bridge with additional lanes and light rail tracks.
- ?? Bi-state coordination of land use, and of interstate transportation.

## C-Tran board has heavy duty meeting

Major decisions facing the C-TRAN board of directors this week involve whether to pursue a joint-use public-private partnership for a park-and-ride facility at the Clark County Fairgrounds, selection of a consultant to prepare a long-range plan and promotion effort, and whether to go ahead with relocating the Vancouver mall transit facility.

The board meets at 5:15 p.m. Tuesday, April 8, in the Pacific Room of Educational Service District 112, 2500 NE 65th Avenue.

The estimated cost of a new 600-space park-and-ride facility at the northwest former of the county fairgrounds is \$4.6 million, 80 percent of which could be paid by a federal grand.

Clark County Partners, a private organization, and the county must first come to an agreement on ownership of the land before C-TRAN could lease the space.

The C-TRAN board will also consider a \$250,000 contract with PB Consult, a New York-based subsidiary of a German company to produce a 20-year development plan, and a public engagement plan, predicated on additional C-TRAN sales tax funding. PB Consult, which has worked with C-TRAN in the past, has a Portland office.

C-TRAN staff will ask board approval for a site selection study to replace the Vancouver Mall Transit Facility at Westfield Shoppingtown.

The facility would remain in the same general vicinity.
