### Comcast hiking cable television rates

Except for its limited basic \$12.50 package, Comcast is raising cable television rates for subscribers in southwest Washington and Oregon.

The rate for standard cable will go to \$41.55, from \$39.04. The cable company's most popular digital cable package will go up \$3 to \$67.99 a month.

The Vancouver-Clark County Cable Telecommunications Commission will review the rate increases at its January meeting but has no authority over cable fees beyond basic cable fees.
