The plank house construction, part of Vancouver and Clark County Lewis and Clark Bicentennial commemoration, is being financed by grants and donations.

The National Park Service has granted the project \$50,000. The Meyer Memorial Trust has awarded \$60,000, which will be doubled if the project receives \$60,000 from other sources.
