Jim Larson grand marshaling Hazel Dell Parade of Bands Saturday

Jim Larson, retired Fire District 6 commissioner, is the grand marshal of the Hazel Dell Parade of Bands that begins at 10:30 a.m. Saturday, May 17, from the Fire District 6 station at 8800 NE Hazel Dell.

Larson was selected, according to parade organizers, for his community service, including his time as a volunteer fireman for ten years before being elected a commissioner of the same district for five six-year terms, and for being the primary booster of the annual Celebrate Freedom Fourth of July fireworks show for more than 30 years.

The parade is free, as is 2-to-6 p.m. entertainment in the Hazel Dell Elementary School, 511 NE Anderson Road. Preceding the parade, the Lion's Club breakfast, from 7 to 10 a.m. is \$4.

The parade route is south from the fire station on Hazel Dell Avenue to NE 63rd Street, where the route crosses the I-5 freeway, then proceeds north on Highway 99 to NE 78th Street.

Partnership delivering computers to help bridge the digital divide

A six-way community partnership, which has been asking for donations of old computers, this week delivered its first refurbished computer to a local family.

Computers, monitors and peripherals may be donated at the Clark County Jail Work Center or Phillips Services Corporation, Washougal.

The jail work center selects computers that can be repaired, reprogrammed and updated and sends them to Clark College, where students complete the work. The computers are returned to the work center to be packaged and sent to the Salvation Army, which matches families to free computers.

Participating in the partnership are the Clark County Public Works Department, Sheriff's Office, City of Vancouver, Clark College Columbia Resource Company and the Salvation Army.
