SWMC Foundation awards scholarships

Southwest Washington will benefit from a record amount of scholarship awards granted this month by the Southwest Washington Medical Center (SWMC) Foundation, which is awarding 63 students, medical professionals and volunteers.

Scholarship committee members reviewed applications from 150 qualified candidates, up from 82 applicants last year. The individual awards range from \$500 to \$5,000. Recipients include high school seniors, healthcare workers studying to advance their careers, medical center volunteers, college students enrolled in a healthcare program of study, including nursing, pharmacy and medical students.

The Foundation more than doubled the number of awards given out by the medical center Auxiliary last year. The Foundation also increased the total dollar amount of scholastic support to \$101,000 compared to the previous record of \$66,500 awarded last year.
