The police department is increasing patrols near apartment complexes during the evening, according to department spokesperson **Marla Schuman**.

Schuman says residents are urged to follow common safety tips, such as keeping doors and windows locked and valuables and vehicles secured. Walking or running with a partner is encouraged.

Since April 29 there have been six reported incidents in which girls or women on the street or in their homes, have been assaulted.
