## Amphitheater neighbors in wait-and-see mode

The Fairgrounds Neighborhood Association, which held Amphitheater in Clark County developer, Quincunx's feet to the fire for five years of negotiations, were in a wait-and-see mode after the first concert last night.

Says association president **Bridget Schwarz**: "Overall, we are still in a wait and see mode. When an act is booked that draws the traffic volume we are concerned about, the noise volume we are concerned about, and the crowd behavior we are concerned about, we'll experience the worst case scenario for impacts will be on our neighborhood. The 8 acts booked so far are all benign."

Schwarz said that for the most part noise was not a problem. The freeway backup, however, was a "prohibited traffic condition," according to Schwarz.

## PDX noise reduction plan workbook updated to include option favorable to Vancouver

Option 9a, calling for westerly outbound flights from Portland International Airport to follow a path south of the Columbia River, has been inserted in a new Port of Portland noise-reduction workbook and has been sent to Vancouver neighborhood associations.

U.S. Rep. **Brian Baird**, who responded to Vancouver requests, asked the Port of Portland to include the option favorable to Vancouver and also to extend the public comment period. The comment period has been extended from July 15 to Aug. 15.

Baird says, "Option 9a has the potential to improve the quality of life for thousands of Vancouver residents who are affected daily by aircraft flying over their homes and businesses.
