County to get nine Lewis & Clark signs

Clark County will be getting nine of 65 Lewis & Clark Bicentennial kiosk signs. The first one in the state will be dedicated Wednesday in Vancouver's Marine Park.

In addition to the Marine Park location, the rustic, log kiosk signs will be at Steigerwald Lake overlook, Steamboat Landing at Cottonwood Beach, the Columbia River landing at the south end of 164th Avenue, Frenchman's Bar overlook, Post Office Lake, Ridgefield National Wildlife Refuge, and one each at the two I-5 Highway Gee Creek rest stops.

The signs were designed by OTAK.

The public is invited to the dedication at Marine Park at 4 p.m. Wednesday, June 30.

State retrofitting bridges to higher standards

Seismic retrofitting of five highway bridges is underway in Clark and Cowlitz counties. In Clark County, the affected bridges are two overpasses on I-5 just south of I-205, an overpass on I-205 just south of I-5 and the Evergreen Blvd./Riverside Dr. overpass on SR 14. In Cowlitz County, the affected bridge is the I-5 bridge over Dike Road near Woodland

Lanes in both directions on Highway 14 have been narrowed for the retrofitting process. Construction is expected to be completed in October.
