Cathlapotle plankhouse celebration gets underway Sunday

The public is invited to join in the Cathlapotle Plankhouse Celebration Sunday, February 23, at the Clark County Historical Museum from 2 to 4:30 p.m.

Lewis and Clark first described the Chinook town of Cathlapotle as they paddled down the Columbia in 1805. They camped overnight nearby and spent several hours visiting and trading at the town before heading upstream on their way back east in March 1806.

A Chinook plankhouse is being constructed on the Ridgefield National Wildlife Refuge near the site of Cathlapotle. The project is supported by the Lewis and Clark Bicentennial Committee of Vancouver/Clark County.

Sunday's celebration will feature hands-on activities for children, refreshments, information about the project and examples of traditional tools and art. Visitors will have the opportunity to visit with members of the Chinook Tribe, meet project archaeologists and meet the project architect, and see plans.
