Clark planners look at comp plan update today; county commissioners. tomorrow

Decisions on how far Clark County cities can grow over the next 20 years are being made today as the county Planning Commission holds what may be its final public hearing on the county Comprehensive Growth Management Plan update at 6 p.m., followed tomorrow at 6:30 p.m., when the Board of County Commissioners holds its first public hearing on update proposals.

The Planning Commission's recommendations will be forwarded to the county commissioners, whose job is to make the final decisions.

Maps proposing the extent to which the cities of Battle Ground, Camas, La Center, Ridgefield, Vancouver, Washougal and Yacolt can grow over the next 20 years will be ready for public viewing at 4 p.m. tomorrow, in the Public Service Center.

The Planning Commission today will also consider how the proposed boundaries will be implemented. These elements involve zoning ordinances, capital facilities plans, and Environmental Impact Statements.

The county commissioner's hearing tomorrow will be the first day of at least three days of hearings.

Testimony will be encouraged from property owners, individual members of the public and neighborhood associations.

The second day of hearings is scheduled for 1:30 p.m. Monday, Dec. 8, at which time testimony from cities, school districts and other governmental agencies is encouraged.

The third day of hearings is set for 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, Dec. 9, so that additional testimony from any interested parties will be considered.

Written testimony also will be accepted and can be mailed to the Board of Clark County Commissioners, P.O. Box 5000, Vancouver, WA 98666. For further information, call **Pat Lee**, 397-2375, extension 4993.
