One out of every three absentee voters has already send in ballot for tomorrow's election

As of today, 35,911 voters have returned completed ballots for the Tuesday general election, reports **Tim Likness**, manager of the Clark County Elections Department. Voters were mailed 107,164 ballots.

In the September primary election, only 28,490 of the total electorate turned out to vote.

Polling places will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. tomorrow, according to Likness. For absentee ballots to count, they must be returned to the elections department by 8 p.m. Tuesday or be postmarked Tuesday.

The heaviest absentee balloting comes in the few days just after ballots are mailed and in the final two days of the election.

Results of the election will be posted in the Firefly Restaurant at the Public Service Center beginning shortly after 8 p.m., and they will be telecast live by CVTV, Channel 23.
