Oregon Department of Transportation begins process to remove Delta Park bottleneck

The Oregon Department of Transportation is holding an open house from 4 to 8 p.m. Monday, April 28, to share ideas on eliminating the southbound I-5 bottleneck from Delta Park to Lombard Street.

ODOT proposes to widen I-5 to three southbound lanes in the current two-lane stretch, widen medians and shoulders, and realign freeway ramps.

The proposal being developed by ODOT is the result of Portland/Vancouver I-5 Transportation and Trade Partnership recommendations.

Planning for the project is expected to continue through 2004, with construction beginning during the summer of 2005 at the earliest.
