A nickel a gallon gets Clark County over \$200 million in transportation benefits; southwest Washington delegation divided

A ten-year \$4.1 billion transportation package, financed by a five-cent-a-gallon gasoline tax increase approved by the Washington State Legislature, will provide Clark County with over \$200 million in transportation improvements, reports **Mark O. Brown**, Vancouver's governmental relations consultant.

"The City of Vancouver is very pleased with this revenue package and the associated project list," Brown says.

The southwest Washington delegation was divided over the proposal. Supporting the measure were Sen. **Don Carlson** (R-49th) and Reps. **Bill Fromhold** (D-49th) and **Jim Moeller** (D-49th). Opposing the measure were Sens. **Don Benton** (R-17th), **Joe Zarelli** (R-18th) and Reps. **Marc Boldt** (R-17th), **Deb Wallace** (D-17th), **Tom Mielke** (R-18th) and **Ed Orcutt** (R-18th).

- Clark County projects included in the package are:
- ?? Highway 500 and NE 112th Avenue interchange, \$21.3 million
- ?? Interstate 205 and Mill Plain Boulevard-NE 112th Avenue extension, \$12 million.
- ?? Interstate 5, Highway 502-NE 219th Street interchange, \$34.7 million.
- ?? Interstate 5-Interstate 205–NE 134th Street improvements, \$40 million.
- ?? Widening Highway 205 to Battle Ground, \$15 million.
- ?? Widening Interstate 5 between NE 99th Street and Salmon Creek, \$34 million.
- ?? 39th Street rail overpass, \$53.7 million.

In addition, the legislature's package includes \$144 million in improvements for Amtrak between Vancouver and Seattle.

The regular session of the legislature has concluded without lawmakers agreeing on either the state capital budget or the state operating budget. These and other fiscal matters will be taken up when the legislature reconvenes in a special session Monday, May 12.
