Through April 30, Columbia River Economic Development Council activity has accounted for over 500 new jobs, reports CREDC president **Bart Phillips**.

The newest of six new companies committed to Clark County locations is Millennium Funding Group, formerly of Portland.

Phillips says the mortgage firm is opening a 20,744square foot office in the Bank of America Building in downtown Vancouver, which will employ 55 persons at the outset, expanding to 80 by the end of the year.
