City council expected to agree to relocate utilities for Meier & Frank expansion

The Vancouver City Council tonight is expected to agree on a \$100,000 relocation of water and sewer lines to facilitate expansion of the Westfield Shoppingtown Meier & Frank store.

At its 7 p.m. meeting the city will take action on a proposal by city staff characterizing the situation thusly:

"Westfield Shoppingtown is seeking to maintain the selection, viability and tax revenue generation of the mall through retention and expansion of an existing anchor tenant in Meier & Frank. Westfield has been in negotiations with the May Company to do a Meier and Frank store expansion at the current Vancouver Location. Westfield feels that if the May company does not expand in the current location, it may move to a proposed mall at the Portland Airport called Cascade Station. Westfield believes that an expansion of the current Vancouver site now will generate \$10 million dollars in new sales and maintain the economic vitality of the existing mall. Westfield feels that this proposed expansion will strengthen the Vancouver site, and may either slow down or significantly alter plans for Cascade Station."

Proposal to enact excise tax for acquisition of greenways and wildlife habitat getting airings

A proposal to place before the voters a .25 percent real estate excise tax to acquire and maintain critical wildlife habitat, greenways and farmland will be discussed in a series of meetings over the next three weeks.

The proposal is the result of a study by an 18-member committee appointed by Clark County commissioners. The tax, if approved by voters, would raise approximately \$45 million over the next ten years.

The committee envisions acquisition of 2,320 to 3,400 acres of critical habitat and greenways and 1,750 to 2,400 acres of farmland.

The 7-to-9 p.m. meetings are Tuesday, June 24, in the Water Resources Education Center, Thursday, June 26, in the Camas Police Department community room, and Tuesday, July 1, in the La Center High School commons.
