Descendant of Declaration of Independence signer to be at showing Tuesday evening

One of 25 extant copies of the Declaration of Independence will be on view from 7 to 9 p.m. Tuesday, Sept. 23, in the Water Resource Education Center.

In attendance will be **Margie Wilson**, Vancouver, who is a direct descendant of a signer of the document, **John Morton**, a Pennsylvania delegate.

The treasured document announcing that the 13 original states were dissolving all allegiance with Great Britain is one of more than 200 copies of the original, which were printed as flyers or broadsides announcing independence.

The document is also on view through Sunday, Sept. 28, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. in the Oregon Historical Society's museum at 1200 SW Park Avenue, Portland.

There is no charge for viewing the declaration at either location.

The Declaration of Independence comes to Vancouver through the support of the Oregon Historical Society.

Tuesday's viewing is the only one during the evening, and some traffic congestion may occur. Parking attendants will be available for traffic control.
