# Master Plan for Clark County fairgrounds on docket for open house tonight

The Clark County Fairgrounds Facilities Committee is holding its second open house on the two-phase Clark County Fairgrounds Master Plan at 7 p.m. tonight in the Fairground s Community Center.

Fair Association executive director **Tom Musser** says, "The successful completion of the amphitheater early this summer, plus the continued development of Weinberg Sports Park , are major steps toward rebuilding the fairgrounds for community benefit."

A preliminary master plan developed by Bullock, Smith and Partners, calls for 330,000 square feet of buildings, many of them new. Cost of improvements would be \$36.5 million.

How improvements to the fairgrounds would be funded is undecided. The fair association's lease with the county expires at the end of the year. Under terms of the current lease amphitheater rent money, \$600,000 in the first year, would be earmarked to pay off fair association debts and make improvements on the grounds.
