Vancouver Symphony presents all American composers, Barber to Sousa this weekend

The Vancouver Symphony, under the baton of resident conductor **Salvador Brotons**, presents an all-American selection of music, ranging from **Samuel Barber**, "Music for a Scene from Shelley," to **John Philip Sousa**'s, "Stars and Stripes Forever," in concerts this weekend in the Skyview High School auditorium, 1300 NW 139th Street.

Highlighting the concerts is piano soloist **Harold Gray**, who will play **George Gershwin**'s "Rhapsody in Blue."

Vancouver Symphony concertmaster **Alexander Bokhman**'s composition, "Spring in Eugene," is also featured in the concert.

The Saturday concert will be preceded at 2 p.m. by a musical conversation with **Lawton "Chick" Hull**, symphony board member and performer.

WSU Vancouver joins PSU in Fort Vancouver National Historic Site dig

Washington State University Vancouver students will join Portland State University students in the National Park Service's third summer archaeology field school work at the Fort Vancouver National Historic Site village.

The 2003 dig will concentrate on House 5, an employee's residence discovered two years ago. In addition, the field crews will survey Pearson Field and perform test excavations in the former orchard near the fort.

At its peak, the fort's village was the largest west coast settlement between San Francisco and Sitka. It comprised over 35 different ethnic and cultural groups, according to **Theresa Langford**, NPS spokesperson.

Sheriff's officers get gun safes for home use

A firearm storage policy adopted by Clark County Sheriff **Garry Lucas** this week includes providing gun safes for firearm storage for all personnel who are issued firearms.

The department has already obtained 200 handgun safes. According to Lucas, sheriff's officers already had purchased some 150 handgun safes for home use.

The new firearms policy follows the death of a sheriff's deputy's daughter at the family home earlier this year.

Lucas says the new policy also involved switching from Ruger P89 handguns to Beretta Vertex handguns.

County commissioners schedule joint GMA meetings with planning commission

Clark County commissioners, wrestling job incentive provisions for an updated growth management plan, have scheduled two joint meetings with the county Planning Commission at 6:30 p.m. Thursday, June 12 and June 19, in the Public Service Center.

Currently on the table are five alternatives that provide a range of regulations aimed at encouraging land development that is tilted toward providing jobs.

The Greater Vancouver Chamber of Commerce has taken issue with the current alternatives as not being enough to encourage job growth over population growth.

The county is expected to complete revisions for the growth plan by the end of the year.
