Clark County one of ten in the nation selected for FEMA training in Maryland

Clark County, one of ten jurisdictions selected by the Federal Emergency Management Agency for its four and a half day Integrated Emergency Management Course, being held in July in Emmitsburg, Md., will be represented by 75 top officials, including county commissioner **Judie Stanton**, county administrator **Bill Barron**, and Vancouver mayor **Royce Pollard**.

FEMA is paying all expenses of the county delegation.

FEMA officials have already been in Clark County designing the site-specific training program, according to Clark Regional Emergency Services Agency chief **Tom Griffith**. Emphasis, among other things, will be on earthquake disaster response.

Griffith says his agency will begin fine-tuning the county's emergency policies and procedures after the federal training concludes.
