Clark County's unadjusted unemployment rate dropped a tenth of a percent in March, dropping form 9.6 percent in February to 9.5 percent, reports the state Department of Employment Security. Clark's unadjusted unemployment rate was 8.5 percent a year ago.

The state unadjusted unemployment rate dropped from 7.6 percent in February to 7.4 percent in March.
