#### Noted political theorist Benjamin Barber to make presentation at WSU Vancouver

Renowned political theorist **Benjamin R. Barber** will discuss "Preventive War or Preventive Democracy" at a Washington State University Vancouver lecture at 7 p.m. Wednesday, April 30.

Barber, who is a consultant to Democratic leaders and a professor of civil society at the University of Maryland, is author of *Jihad vs. McWorld*, published in 1995 and updated in 2001. His newest book, *Fear's Empire: Terrorism, War and Democracy*, will be published this summer.

Barber's appearance is sponsored by WSU Vancouver's Foley Institute and the Associated Students of WSU Vancouver. The lecture is free. A reception follows the program.

## Vancouver picked for regional site of Lewis and Clark traveling exhibit

Vancouver has been selected by the National Park Service as a regional stop-over for its traveling Lewis and Clark exhibit. The exhibit is tentatively scheduled for a ten-day setup in the Vancouver National Historic Reserve, arriving Nov. 4 and leaving Nov. 13, 2005.

The Corps of Discovery II, as the exhibit is known, left Monticello in Virginia last January to travel to various Lewis and Clark sites through the bicentennial celebration which ends in 2006.

The exhibit includes live performances, music and demonstrations.
