The results of a study, commissioned by the Oregon Department of Transportation on the economic effects of congestion on the Interstate-5 Columbia River crossing, will be presented at a breakfast meeting at 7 a.m. Thursday, May 8, in the Red Lion Hotel at the Quay.

Lance Grenzbach, senior vice president of Cambridge Systematics, the transportation planning, economics, and consulting firm that conducted the study, will discuss the impact of traffic congestion on the Columbia River crossing on key Washington-Oregon industries.
