Some automated electric meters being recalled for failure to communicate

Several hundred of Clark Public Utilities' 155,000 residential automated electric meters are being recalled by the company that sold them to the utility because their transmitters have failed, Rick Dyer, Clark Public Utilities finance director, told utility commissioners today.

Dyer said none of the customers whose meter transmitters have been found faulty have had their meters read wrong, nor have they been misbilled.

"When a 'no reading' shows up on the computer of the meter reading vehicle, someone is sent out to actually physically read the meter," according to Dyer.

The meters are working properly," Dyer said. "The problem is that a diode has failed in some meter transmitters.'

According to Dyer, when more meter transmitters were failing than ordinarily would have been expected, the utility took the matter up with the company, Itron, that had sold them to Clark.

Itron, Dyer reported, is recalling all meters with faulty transmitters. Customers whose meter transmitters have been found faulty will be sent a letter and the meter will be replaced, Dyer said.
