**Christine Gregoire**, Washington State Attorney General Wednesday, July 30, will announce from the bandstand at Esther Short Park why she is running for governor.

Gregoire, who will be introduced by former State Sen. **Al Bauer**, is expected to be in Vancouver for the announcement at about 1:15 p.m. She is on a swing through four other cities as she begins her campaigning for the 2004 election.
