Nonprofit Resource Center opens in Vancouver Community Library Thursday

Until the Nonprofit Resource Center in the Vancouver Community Library opens Thursday, July 10, those in southwest Washington seeking information on grants and researching nonprofit organization resource topics have to go to the Multnomah County.

The Community Foundation for Southwest Washington, and the Fort Vancouver Regional Library and its

foundation, have changed that.

A section in the Vancouver Library at 1007 E. Mill Plain Boulevard has been set aside for the Nonprofit Resource Center. In addition to a reference collection of books and periodicals, the center includes two dedicated computers for further research.

Thousands involved in Clark Public Utilities' Salmon in the Classroom education program

More than 10,000 students, parents and teachers participated in Clark Public Utilities' "Salmon in the Classroom" programs in the past year, according to **Dean Sutherland**, the utility's senior manager of communications and community relations.

The Salmon in the Classroom program grew out of a 1996 utility project of raising salmon and steelhead in pens at Klineline Pond on Salmon Creek, and then releasing them to populate the stream and provide for kids' fishing derbies.

The program now aimed at 4th and 5th graders has grown to one that provides 45 aquariums in classrooms, salmon hatching egg boxes for other classrooms, continued raising of fish and stocking Salmon Creek, and kids' fish derbies at three locations.

Part of its community outreach, the utility has developed a partnership with the Columbia Springs Environmental Education Center, the state Department of Fish and Wildlife, SWIFT, local Rotary and Kiwanis Clubs, and citizens.

Sutherland said that 160,000 steelhead have been reared and released into Salmon Creek in the past eight years and that 70,000 coho salmon are hatched and released annually into Salmon and Whipple Creeks.
