## University of Phoenix to open Vancouver campus in West Coast Bank Building

The University of Phoenix, a private institution of higher learning specializing in adult education founded in 1976, will open a branch in Vancouver this month and, by early 2004, will have a learning center in the West Coast Bank Building.

According to **Pat Hardie**, the school's vice president/campus director for Oregon, students enrolling in programs in the Vancouver learning center will attend classes at a temporary site at the Red Lion Inn at the Quay.

Two programs begin this month, Hardie says: a bachelor of science in business management and a masters degree in business administration.

The university, which boasts a worldwide student population of nearly 170,000, is the largest private university in the country. In addition to five learning centers in Oregon, the university has learning centers in Seattle, Tacoma and Spokane.

The University of Phoenix provides students with flexible schedules tied to classroom studies at the beginning and end of a course, with most of the course work being done on the Internet.

According to **David Tucker**, director of academic affairs, many of the faculty members live or work in Vancouver.
