Tom Koenninger, editor emeritus of the Columbian, has been presented the 2003 Award for Leadership from the Trustees Association of Community and Technical Colleges.

The Skills Center serves eight southwest Washington school districts and, since 1983, has graduated over 13,000 students, all of whom have successfully entered the job market or gone on to college.
