Tom Koeninger earns state leadership award

Tom Koeninger, editor emeritus of the *Columbian*, has been presented the 2003 Award for Leadership from the Trustees Association of Community and Technical Colleges.

Koeninger is completing his second consecutive term as chair of the state Board for Community and Technical Colleges, which governs the state system of 34 public two-year colleges. He has been reappointed to the board for a four-year term by Gov. **Gary Locke**.

Koeninger was recognized for his inspired leadership and his tireless advocacy for the community and technical college system. He was named an outstanding alumnus of Clark College in 1990.

The Clark County Skills Center will celebrate its 20th anniversary Saturday, May 31, with the dedication of the \$1 million Firstenburg Technology Center at the 12200 NE 18th Street Campus.

The 13,000-square-foot building will house 240 students in financial customer services, electro-digital technologies and pre-engineering/design technology.

Funding for the center was provided by the Ed and Mary Firstenburg Family Fund through the Community Foundation for Southwest Washington.

The dedication is at 10 a.m. An open house, entertainment, car show, and tours of the campus continue through 3 p.m.

The Skills Center serves eight southwest Washington school districts and, since 1983, has graduated over 13,000 students, all of whom have successfully entered the job market or gone on to college.
