## Southwest Clean Air Agency moving to EastRidge Business Park in September

After 15 years at the same location, 1308 NE 134th Street, Southwest Clean Air Agency is moving to 5,856 square feet of office space in the EastRidge Business Park, east of Highway 503 between the Padden Parkway and NE 99th Street.

The air monitoring and regulating agency ended speculation that it would build and own a headquarters by authorizing executive director **Bob Elliott** to find office space in a more suitable location.

Elliott says the new space will be configured for computerized operations and has public space as well as office space for 17 employees.

"We have a very favorable seven-year lease at EastRidge," Elliott says. "The new location provides for easier access by the public."

The move is scheduled to begin Friday, Sept. 5, and to be completed Monday, Sept. 8. The office will be closed Monday, but all lines of communication will be open.

## New hours at Clark County vehicle licensing department to improve service, reduce costs

Although the hours that the new county vehicle licensing department is open to the public have decreased, customer service will be improved and costs will be lowered because of less overtime, reports Clark County Auditor **Greg Kimsey**.

Both the Department of Vehicle Licensing and the Department of Elections have been moved to 1408 Franklin Street, just north of the new Public Service Center.

Vehicle licensing hours are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., says Kimsey. He says the Elections Department hours of 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. are unchanged.
