Clark/Vancouver Television launches second channel

Clark/Vancouver Television, the local government cable station CVTV, seen on Channel 23, will also be seen on Channel 21 from 5 p.m. to 7:30 a.m. daily, beginning Sunday, Sept. 14.

The second channel is scrambled between 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. each day for city and county cable television training purposes.

CVTV 2, Channel 21, will offer additional live and replayed coverage of local government hearings and community events, according to video production coordinator **Mark Boyer**. CVTV programming originates from studios at 202 E. Mill Plain Boulevard.

Gov. Locke and state delegation to help cut ribbon on Starbucks store in Beijing

More than 70 Washington business people have signed on to Gov. **Gary Locke**'s second trade mission to China, Oct. 11 through Oct. 18. The governor and members of the delegation will help open a Starbucks store in Beijing on Tuesday, Oct. 14.

China is Washington's second largest trading partner. Japan is first. In all, Washington is the fourth largest exporting state in the United States, generating sales of \$95 billion last year.
