## Nierenbergs help establish foundation memorial honoring Dave Chamberlain

David Nierenberg, president of the Evergreen School District Foundation, has established a memorial fund honoring Dave Chamberlain, 47-year-old school district board member, who died in November.

Nierenberg said he and his wife, Patricia, will match the amount made to the foundation in Chamberlain's name up to the first \$50,000.

"Chamberlain was an outstanding human being and a wonderful and thoughtful school board member, who truly cared about every child in the Evergreen School District," Nierenberg said.

## Southwest Washington Medical Center Foundation boosts Clark's Nursing Program

Clark College has been given a \$36,000 grant for its Increased Enrollment Pilot Project by the Southwest Washington Medical Center Foundation's Healthier Communities Committee.

The program is designed to bring in immediately an additional eight students into the second year of nursing for advanced placement students.

Up to 70 percent of Clark College nursing graduates go on to work at Southwest Washington Medical Center.

"It is critical to address the future needs for nurses in the region as the demand for health related services continues to escalate," according to Jan Oliva, Healthier Communities Committee chairwoman.

Targeting licensed practical nurses, the program is expected to boost the number of registered nursing graduates from 22 to 28 students per term to 34 to 40 per term.

The Clark College program, one of the largest in the northwest, admits and graduates nursing students three times a year.

## County residents are eligible for Citizen Emergency Response Team Training

Classes designed to help individuals and couples provide emergency assistance during county emergencies and disasters are beginning in January.

The course work, which addresses light search and rescue operations, disaster psychology and team organization, and medical operations, is being presented through the Vancouver Fire Department, North County Emergency Services and most county fire districts.

Training is \$20, and includes a text book, uniform vest and safety helmet. Deadline for applications is Thursday, Jan. 9. For further information, call Leah Edwards, 576-1195.
