# County Treasurer's office first to open in new Community Service Center next Wednesday

The Clark County Treasurer's office will be the first to be open for business at the new Public Service Center, 1300 Franklin Street, next Wednesday.

By the end of January the Clark County Treasurer, Assessor and Auditor collectively will staff a onestop counter on the second floor of the \$22.4 million building, designed by architects Barren-

tine.Bates.Lee.AIA, Vancouver.

"This is a *public service building*," county administrator **Bill Barron** declared at the beginning of a press tour of the six-story, 161,000-square-foot structure. "It's not an administrative building. It's design and purpose is to provide public service.

"In addition to providing combined services of the Treasurer, Assessor and Auditor on the second floor, the county's Community Development Department's permit center is located just off the first floor main main entrance.

"The county and Vancouver environmental services and solid waste offices share space on the first floor. County, city and regional transportation offices are combined, utilizing the entire fourth floor."

The Public Service Center and courthouse remodeling, which begins later this month, is part of a long-term way of fixing some of the county's most severe problems: adequate housing for public services, according to **Craig Pridemore**, chair of the county board of commissioners.

It is cost-effective, too, Pridemore said. Total cost of the new building, county courthouse and Franklin Center upgrades and 504-space pareking structure is \$40.9 million.

"This building will save the county \$46 million in rent over the next 25 years," Pridemore says.

The remodeled courthouse just south of the Public Service Center on Franklin Street will house additional superior judges and court rooms. The county prosecuting attorney's offices will be housed in the Franklin Center, 1013 Franklin Street.

The 1408 Franklin Street building is also being remodeled and will house the elections department and automobile licensing space.

The new building solves one of county government's most vexing problems: providing adqequate space for audiences at commissioners' and other agencies' public hearings.
