Rich Melnick named district court judge

Richard A. Melnick yesterday was appointed as a judge of the Clark County District Court.

The selection was made by Clark County commissioners, who were filling a vacancy created by the January resignation of **Randal Fritzler**.

Melnick, a senior deputy Clark County prosecuting attorney who has been with the office since 1980, is best known for having started the prosecutor's domestic violence intervention program and for helping develop the county Superior Court's drug court program.

Melnick earned his law degree from the Northwestern School of Law at Lewis and Clark College.
