

Planning commission offering informal discussion of Vancouver annexation plans



The Vancouver Planning Commission's First Tuesday presentation in City Hall at 4 p.m. Tuesday, June 1, includes a discussion of Vancouver's ten year annexation blueprint.

If it were to annex the area within its urban growth boundaries, Vancouver would become the state's second largest city with over 200,000 residents.

Since Vancouver's incorporation in 1857 there have been 127 annexations. During the past decade the city expanded by 29 miles, increasing its population by nearly 100,000 people, to become the fourth largest city in the state.
