Little buses more efficient, easier to board



Battle Ground councilmember Bill Ganley and Clark County commissioner Betty Sue Morris earlier this month helped inaugurate C-TRAN little bus service on Battle Ground Route 7. Smaller, more efficient little bus holds 23 passengers, is easier to board.

C-TRAN this month began replacing ten of its oldest full-size buses with ten 29-foot, 23-passenger buses using federal grant funds received in 2003 for its bus replacement program.

The new low-riding buses are more efficient, produce fewer emissions and are easier to board, having only one step from the curb. They also have panoramic windows.

C-TRAN executive director/CEO **Lynne Griffith** says the decision to replace some of the aging fleet with smaller buses was based on public requests to use smaller buses where appropriate.
