John Wiesman

John M. Wiesman, manager of the Prevention Division for Seattle & King County Public Health, has been appointed director of the Clark County Health Department.

Wiesman succeeds **Kay Koontz**, who is retiring at the end of July. Koontz had been director of the Southwest Washington Health District for several years before it was subsumed by Clark County.

The county Health Department has an annual budget of \$14 million and 158 employees.

Wiesman, a graduate of Lawrence University, holds a masters degree in public health from Yale University. Wiesman has prior experience with the University of Washington School of Public Health and the Tacoma-Pierce County Health Department.
