## City council may dump Rosemere Neighborhood Association tonight

The Vancouver City Council tonight will consider a resolution withdrawing city recognition of the Rosemere Neighborhood Association during its 6 p.m. session tonight in City Hall.

Expelling the association would be a first for the city. According to city attorney **Ted Gathe**, the association has not responded to corrective measures ordered by city manager **Pat McDonnell**.

Disagreements between the city and the association's board accelerated last year when the association board tried to calm association meetings by restricting voting membership.

The city has asked the association board for information and records, which the association says the city does not have the right to see.

On Dec. 31, 2003, the association filed a complaint with the Internal Revenue Service that requests for information by the city and by private citizens are part of a harassment campaign by both the city and private individuals.
