Home and Garden Idea Fair, region's largest plant sale, showcases energy conservation

Clark Public Utilities Home and Garden Idea Fair, opening at 9 a.m. Friday, April 23, at the Clark County Fairgrounds, is backed by 80 nurseries, making it the largest plant sale in the Vancouver-Portland region.

The three-day event showcases energy conservation, including a zero energy home that produces more energy than it uses for non-heating purposes, and a display of Toyota gasoline-electric hybrid cars. The Toyota Prius hybrid was named 2004 *Motor Trend* Car of the Year.

The show is free, but donations of canned food are encouraged. Parking is \$3.
