Jennifer Bufford comes in third in national science competition

Jennifer Bufford, Columbia River High School senior, last weekend won third place in the National Junior Science and Humanities Symposium in Baltimore, Md.

Her project was the presentation of a paper on examining hazel nut tree callus, cuttings and mediums, which were being grown to produce taxol, an anticancer drug.

More than 400 high school students participated in the National Academy of Science program sponsored by the U.S. Army, Navy and Air Force.

Last year, Bufford's classmate, **Eugene Kim**, also placed third in the symposium's competition, with a paper on treatment techniques involving external beam radiation therapy for cancer.
