

U.S. Department of Health and Human Services picks Joseph Price for panel

Joseph Price, a behavioral health faculty member at Family Medicine of Southwest Washington, is among a select group of health care practitioners asked to join a national advisory panel on primary care education. Price will serve a three-year term on the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Advisory Committee on Training in Primary Care Medicine.

The 23-member advisory group will make recommendations to the department on how to spend \$100 to \$300

million annually for primary care medicine education.

"We think it speaks nicely of Family Medicine and Southwest Washington Medical Center to have a direct voice or conduit to the DSHA," Price said of the appointment.

As a faculty member of Southwest Washington Medical Center's family medicine residency program, Price teaches residents about behavioral aspects of primary care medicine.

According to Price, about 70 percent of the nation's mental health care is provided by primary care physicians.
