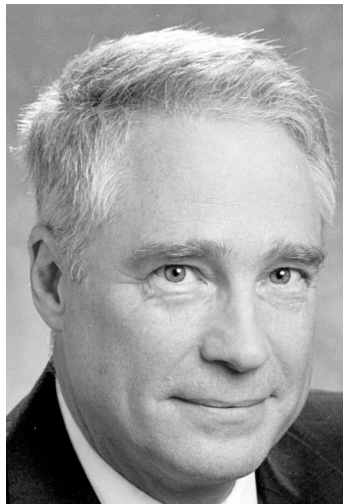


Jonathan Gill and Trent Kunz join Blair Schaefer Hutchison & Wolfe
