## Dan Heine opening Lake Oswego Bank

**Dan Heine**, who served as president of TODAY'S BANK from its inception five years ago until its merger with Riverview Community Bank last year, is opening The Bank of Oswego in Lake Oswego.

Heine, co-founder and chief executive officer of bank being located in the new Lake View Village in downtown Lake Oswego, has 35 years of banking experience.

The bank will capitalize at \$15 million and, subject to regulatory approval, opens this spring.

Heine who was active in community affairs in Vancouver has moved to Lake Oswego.

## Clark Public Utilities, working with City of Vancouver, will extend underground lines

Clark Public Utilities' policy of providing the cost of overhead transmission and distribution lines in the form of payment to organizations requesting underground transmission, has been extended to the City of Vancouver by interlocal agreement to two separate projects.

Utility commissioners approved an agreement that will eliminate overhead distribution in the vicinity of the city's downtown Esther Short Park and Hilton Hotel and conference center areas.

The downtown project is expected to cost about \$500,000, with the utility contributing up to \$100,000 of that cost.

The second project covers a primary transmission line running nearly a mile from Highway 14 along the location of SE 192nd Avenue. Cost of that project is \$1.5 million, with the utility providing up to one-third of the cost. SE 192nd Avenue will connect SE 34th Street and Highway 14.

State Sen. **Don Carlson**, who supports the study, says further consideration of enhancing higher education opportunities for southwest Washington is called for.

While the bill states that cooperation between Washington State University Vancouver and its two community colleges is successful, southwest Washington remains the largest urban area in the state without an in-state, public, four-year institution of higher education
