## Weather roundup and closures

Although some thawing was beginning to occur about 1 p.m. today, all state routes and interstate highways in the entire region had compact snow with up to an inch of ice on top.

All Clark County snow plows and sanders and Vancouver equipment are reported working throughout the day. Significant improvement is not expected until tomorrow.

All Clark County offices, including superior and district courts, were closed today. All Vancouver offices were also closed for the day. Scheduled public meetings and hearings were canceled.

Public schools throughout the county were closed, as was Clark College. Fort Vancouver Regional Library District branches in Clark County were also closed.

A scheduled appearance today for a Greater Vancouver Chamber of Commerce luncheon by U.S. Sen. **Patty Murray** (D-Wash.) was canceled when the senator was unable to travel to Vancouver because of road conditions.

Ticket holders will be reimbursed, according to chamber vice president **Addison Jacobs**.

By mid-morning Clark Public Utilities reported an estimated 2,000 electric customers were without power. The largest outage involved about 250 customers in the vicinity of Mill Plain Boulevard, and Brandt Road. Other outages were in the Harney and Evergreen Highway areas of Vancouver, Brush Prairie, Woodland, and Hazel Dell. There are several other smaller outages as well.

Outages also occurred in east Vancouver, Prune Hill, west Camas, Burton Road, and Lucia Falls.

In addition to the utility's own employees, several contract crews have also been brought in to assist with repair work.

The major problems were tree limbs weighted down with ice getting into the lines. Earlier this morning, outages affected as many as 4,000 customers.
