The hospital has been approved for 220 patient beds, which includes a 15-bed neonatal intensive care unit. The current Legacy Salmon Creek medical staff has credentialed more than 400 physicians.

Legacy Health System is a regional health system operating five hospitals, 17 physician clinics, and other medical services.
