Steve Stuart campaign kickoff Tuesday, May 30, at Johnny O's

Steve Stuart, although a Clark County commissioner for less than two years, is running for that partisan office for a second time, he will be announcing at a campaign kickoff event at 4:30 p.m. Tuesday, May 30, at Johnny O's Restaurant, 801 Washington Street.

Democrat Stuart was appointed to the three-member board of commissioners in December 2004, to fill the unexpired position held by **Craig Pridemore**, who successfully ran for state senate. In 2005 Stuart stood for election for the final year of Pridemore's term and went on to beat former state representative Republican **Tom Mielke** in that race.

This year Stuart is running for a full four-year term on the board. His competition this time is expected to be former Vancouver mayor **Bruce Hagensen**, who says he will be running for the position as a Republican.

Candidates for local and state elections will officially file during the week of July 24. The primary election is Tuesday, Sept. 19. The general election is Tuesday, Nov. 7.
