Commissioners to continue study of allocation of growth to cities Tuesday

During a 2 p.m. Tuesday, Sept. 6, work session, Clark County commissioners will continue deliberations leading to determination of the amount of urban growth areas to be allocated individual municipalities in the county as part of a revised Comprehensive Growth Management Plan.

The new growth areas are expected to be larger than those allocated in the growth plan adopted last year, but never implemented. Only the City of Vancouver has not requested any substantial changes to its growth area.

The work session will be in the Public Service Center, 1300 Franklin Street.
