County commissioners holding special work session Monday to discuss I-912

Clark County commissioners have called a special work session for 4 p.m. Monday, Oct. 3, to discuss the extent of losses in revenue for county and state road projects should Initiative 912 be approved, negating new gasoline-tax financed projects.

If the measure is approved by voters, most of the major planned improvements on I-5 and I-205 in the county would be set back. In addition, the funding promised for a \$50 million study of a new Columbia River Crossing at the present location of the Interstate Bridge would be eliminated.

The initiative seeks to overturn the 9.5 cents per gallon gasoline tax that would have been phased in over the next several years.
