## **Marcia Howery to receive YMCA Spirit of Health Award**

**Marcia Howery**, a former Montessori teacher who was the first employee hired by the Free Clinic in 1990, has been named as the 2006 recipient of the Clark County Family YMCA's Spirit of Health Award.

The award will be presented during the YMCA's Strong Communities Benefit Luncheon at noon, Monday, Sept. 18, in the Hilton Vancouver Washington. **Dan Fouts**, former University of Oregon quarterback, NFL Hall of Fame member, and currently an ABC sports analyst, is the keynote speaker.

Howery joined the fledgling Free Clinic as a clinic coordinator. Currently she is the Free Clinic's clinic director, managing more than 500 volunteers, most of whom are medical practitioners, including doctors, dentists, pharmacists, nurses and technicians. During that time Howery says the clinic has helped treat tens of thousands of patients.

"Marcia's compassion is only matched by her wealth of knowledge in putting resources together to make a difference in the lives of Clark County residents," the award citation reads. "Marcia has been instrumental in the clinic's success."

The clinic was founded by retired physician **Sam Beall**. The clinic provides health care to persons without health insurance or other resources to pay for vital health services.

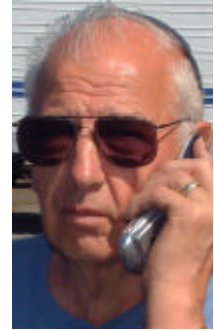
